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3 Relating to local emergency management organizations; 4 to amend Section 31-9-9, Code of Alabama 1975, to further 5 provide for mutual aid agreements with other public or private 6 agencies for reciprocal aid to protect public health and 7 safety; to vest the authority in the governing body; to amend 8 Section 31-9-11, Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide that 9 employees of political subdivisions have the same powers and 10 immunities when they act outside of the political subdivision pursuant to a mutual aid agreement; and to make nonsubstantive 11 12 changes to update the existing code language to current style.

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Section 1. Sections 31-9-9 and 31-9-11, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

organization for emergency management may develop or cause—to be developed—mutual aid agreements with other public and private agencies within this state for reciprocal emergency management aid and assistance in case of disaster too great to be dealt with unassisted. The governing body may also develop or cause to be developed mutual aid agreements with other public or private agencies within the state for reciprocal aid and assistance to protect the public peace, health, and safety, and to preserve the lives and property of the people of the state. Such agreements shall be consistent with the state emergency management plan and program, and a copy of



- 42 organization for emergency management may develop or cause to
- 43 be-developed mutual aid agreements with federally recognized
- 44 Indian tribes located within the state.
- (d) For purposes of this section, "governing body"
- 46 means the political subdivision establishing the local
- 47 organization for emergency management pursuant to Section
- 48 31-9-10."

- 50 Whenever the employees of any political subdivision are
- 51 rendering outside aid pursuant to a mutual aid agreement
- 52 authorized by Section 31-9-9 or the authority contained in
- 53 Section 31-9-10, such the employees shall have the same powers,
- 54 duties, rights, privileges, and immunities as if they were
- 55 performing their duties in the political subdivisions in which
- they are normally employed."
