CONTRACT FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING AND ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES

This Contract for **Professional Services** is made and entered into by and between the County of Baldwin (hereinafter called "COUNTY") acting by and through its governing body, the Baldwin County Commission and Gresham Smith, (hereinafter referred to as "PROVIDER").

WITNESSETH:

Whereas, at its regular meeting on Tuesday, December 17, 2024, the COUNTY authorized staff to solicit a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for Engineering/Environmental Services for the Roundabout on County Road 13 at Corte Road; and

Whereas, the PROVIDER presented the best qualifications for Engineering and Environmental services and was chosen by the COUNTY to provide needed services in accordance with the Request for Qualifications (RFQ) and Response.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants herein contained, the sufficiency of which being hereby acknowledged, PROVIDER and COUNTY do hereby agree as follows:

I. <u>Definitions</u>. The following terms shall have the following meanings:

A. COUNTY:

Baldwin County, Alabama

B. COMMISSION:

Baldwin County Commission

C. PROVIDER:

Gresham Smith

II. <u>Obligations Generally.</u> The COUNTY hereby retains, and the PROVIDER agrees to perform for the COUNTY, those professional services as hereinafter set forth. This document shall serve as the binding contract for the services of PROVIDER. PROVIDER shall immediately commence performance of the services outlined herein upon full execution of this Contract. All work shall be commenced and completed in a timely manner as, and at the times, herein set out.

- **III.** <u>Recitals Included.</u> The above recitals and statements are incorporated as part of this Contract, and shall have the effect and enforceability as all other provisions herein.
- IV. <u>Professional Qualifications</u>. For the purpose of this Contract, the PROVIDER represents and warrants to the COUNTY that it possesses the professional, technical, and administrative personnel with the specific experience and training necessary to provide the professional services required herein.
- V. <u>No Prohibited Exclusive Franchise</u>. The COUNTY neither perceives nor intends, by this Contract, a granting of an exclusive franchise or violation of Art. I, Section 22 of the Alabama Constitution.
- VI. Representation/Warranty of Certifications, Etc. PROVIDER represents and warrants that PROVIDER is presently certified, licensed and otherwise permitted under all necessary and applicable laws and regulations to perform the services herein, and that PROVIDER shall renew, maintain, and otherwise ensure that all such certifications, licenses, and permits are current and valid, without interruption, for and through completion of the services. The representation and warranty aforesaid is a material inducement to the COUNTY in entering this Contract, and the parties agree that the breach thereof shall be deemed material at the County's option.
- **VII.** <u>Legal Compliance.</u> PROVIDER shall at all times comply with all applicable federal, State, local and municipal laws and regulations.
- VIII. Independent Contractor. PROVIDER acknowledges that it is an independent contractor, and PROVIDER shall at all times remain as such in performing the services under this Contract. PROVIDER is not an employee, servant, partner, or agent of the COUNTY and has no authority, whether express or implied, to contract for or bind the COUNTY in any manner. The parties agree that PROVIDER shall be solely responsible for and shall have full and unqualified control over developing and implementing its own means and methods, as it deems necessary and appropriate in providing the aforementioned services, and that the COUNTY's interests herein are expressly limited to the results of said services. PROVIDER is not entitled to unemployment insurance benefits, and PROVIDER is responsible for and obligated to pay any and all federal and state income tax on any monies paid pursuant to this Contract.
- IX. No Agency Created. It is neither the express nor the implied intent of PROVIDER or COUNTY to create an agency relationship pursuant to this Contract. Therefore, the PROVIDER does not in any manner act on behalf of COUNTY and the creation of such a relationship is prohibited and void.
- **X.** <u>Unenforceable Provisions.</u> If any one or more of the provisions contained herein shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, then such provision or provisions shall be deemed severable from the remaining provisions hereof, and such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability

shall not affect any other provision hereof. This Contract shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

XI. <u>Entire Agreement.</u> This Contract represents the entire and integrated agreement between COUNTY and PROVIDER and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements, either written or oral. This Contract may be amended only by written instrument signed by all parties.

XII. <u>Failure to Strictly Enforce Performance</u>. The failure of the COUNTY to insist upon the strict performance of any of the terms, covenants, agreements, and conditions of this Contract shall not constitute, and shall never be asserted by PROVIDER as constituting, a default or be construed as a waiver or relinquishment of the right of the COUNTY to thereafter enforce any such term, covenant, agreement, or condition, but the same shall continue in full force and effect.

XIII. <u>Assignment.</u> This Contract or any interest herein shall not be assigned transferred or otherwise encumbered by PROVIDER without the prior written consent of the COUNTY, which may be withheld or granted in the sole discretion of the COUNTY.

XIV. Ownership of Documents/Work. The COUNTY shall be the owner of all copyright or other intellectual property rights in reports, documents and deliverables produced and paid for under this Contract, and to the extent permitted by Alabama law, any such material may be reproduced and reused at the discretion of the COUNTY without payment of further consideration. PROVIDER shall not transfer, disclose, or otherwise use such information for any purpose other than in performance of the services hereunder, without the COUNTY's prior written consent, which may be withheld or granted in the sole discretion of the COUNTY.

XV. <u>Notice.</u> Notice required herein shall be in writing, unless otherwise allowed, and said notice shall be deemed effective when received at the following addresses:

XVI. Services to be Rendered. PROVIDER is retained by the COUNTY as a professionally-qualified engineer. The general scope of work for the services shall include all the terms and Conditions of "Request for Qualifications", the same being expressly incorporated herein by reference, and without limitation will encompass:

"All provision and conditions and/or specifications listed/stated in the Request for Qualifications for Engineering/Environmental Services for Roundabout on County Road 13 at Corte Road Project for the Baldwin County Commission".

- A. PROVIDER will provide ongoing communications with COUNTY regarding this service, including updates, emails and etc. as requested. Additionally, PROVIDER will meet with COUNTY as needed or requested.
- B. PROVIDER is responsible for the professional quality, technical accuracy, timely completion and coordination of all services furnished by or in relation to this Contract. Notwithstanding this requirement, PROVIDER shall closely coordinate the subject services with the COUNTY and designated personnel.
- C. PROVIDER represents and warrants that its services shall be performed within the limits and standards provided by the COUNTY, in a manner consistent with the level of care and skill ordinarily exercised by similar providers under similar circumstances at the time the services are performed.
- D. PROVIDER shall use MicroStation and Inroads software for project design unless otherwise specified in the scope of work agreement.

XVII. Attachments: The exhibits and/or attachments listed below are specifically included as a necessary part of this agreement and the same shall not be complete without such items, to wit:

- A. Attachment A RFQ Advertisement
- B. Attachment B RFQ Award
- C. Attachment C Proposal Including Scope of Work and Fee Schedule
- D. Attachment D Certificate of Insurance
- E. Attachment E Terms and Conditions of Data Use

COUNTY and PROVIDER, if necessary, shall jointly cause such items as listed above to contain dates, signatures of the parties with authorization to make such signatures, and sufficient marks and references back to this Agreement noting their inclusion and attachment hereto. In any event of a

conflict between this document and the attachments referenced above, this document shall govern.

XVIII. General Responsibilities of the COUNTY.

- A. The COUNTY shall provide reasonable notice to PROVIDER whenever the COUNTY actually observes or otherwise actually becomes aware of any development that affects the scope or time of PROVIDER's services hereunder or any defect or nonconformance in the work of PROVIDER.
- B. The COUNTY shall pay to PROVIDER the compensation as, and subject to the terms set out below.
- C. The COUNTY shall provide any necessary notices to commence, Discontinue, or terminate the services herein described.

XIX. <u>Termination of Services</u>. The COUNTY or PROVIDER may terminate this contract, with or without cause or reason, by giving the (10) days written notice of such to the other party. Upon receipt of such notices, PROVIDER shall discontinue its work to the extent specified in the notice.

In the event of termination, the COUNTY shall pay PROVIDER for all services satisfactorily rendered, and for any expenses deemed by COUNTY to be a reimbursable expense incurred pursuant to this Contract and prior to the date of termination.

XX. Compensation Limited. The compensation to be paid to the PROVIDER shall be the full compensation for all work performed by PROVIDER under this Contract. All additional expenditures or expenses of PROVIDER, not listed in full within this Contract, shall not be considered as a part of this Contract and shall not be demanded by PROVIDER or paid by COUNTY unless the additional costs are approved by the COUNTY in the form of a written Change Order. Compensation to PROVIDER for work shall be paid in accordance with the Scope of Work. Said compensation shall be all inclusive, including without limitations, reimbursement of all cost, incidents and operating expenses associated with those directly engaged in performance of the requested services.

XXI. Method of Payment. PROVIDER shall submit invoices to the COUNTY for payment for work performed. Such invoice shall be accompanied by a detailed account of compensation to be paid PROVIDER.

Payment shall be made by the COUNTY within thirty (30) days of the approval of the invoice submitted by the PROVIDER. The COUNTY agrees to review and approve invoices submitted for payment in a timely manner.

XXII. Effective and Termination Dates. This Contract shall be effective and commence immediately upon the same date as its full execution, and same shall terminate upon either the expiration of thirty-six (36) months or upon a written notification thereof received by either party within the required ten (10) day period. [Nothing herein stated shall prohibit the parties from otherwise terminating this Contract according to the provisions herein.]

XXIII. Force Majeure. The Parties hereto shall incur no liability to the other if performance becomes impossible or impracticable by reason of an event or effect that the parties could neither have anticipated nor controlled. This allowance shall include both an act of nature and acts of third parties. Any costs that would otherwise be incurred and/or necessitated by the provisions herein shall be alleviated for either party by such event or effect.

XXIV. <u>Indemnification.</u> Provider shall indemnify, defend and hold County, and its Commissioners, affiliates, employees, agents, and representatives (collectively "County") harmless from and against any and all claims, demands, liabilities, damages, losses, judgments, costs, and expenses including, without limitations, attorneys' fees, and costs, for any and all personal injury (including death) and property damage of any kind or nature whatsoever, incurred by, asserted against, or imposed upon County, as a result of or in any manner related to provision of services hereunder, or any act or omission, by Provider. Contractor shall provide the COUNTY with proof of general liability coverage including the COUNTY as an additional insured. This indemnification shall survive the expiration or termination of this Contract.

XXV. <u>Number of Originals.</u> This Contract shall be executed with three (3) originals, each of which are equally valid as an original.

XXVI: Governing Law: This Contract in all respects, including without limitation its formation, validity, construction, enforceability and available remedies, shall be governed by the laws of the State of Alabama, without regard to Alabama conflict of law principles.

XXVII: Insurance: Prior to performing services pursuant to this Contract, Provider shall carry, with insurers satisfactory to County, throughout the term of hereof, Auto Liability Insurance, including owned, hired and non-owned vehicles. with limits of not less than \$1,000,000, combined single limit, for both bodily injury liability and property damage liability each occurrence; Commercial General Liability Insurance, including all contractual liability hereunder, with limits not less than \$1,000,000, combined single limit, for both bodily injury liability and property damage liability each occurrence; and Worker's Compensation Insurance, meeting the statutory limits of the State of Alabama and Employer's Liability Insurance fully covering all employees and supervisors participating in the work at the subject property site. All liability insurance shall name the County as an additional insured. Prior to commencing operations hereunder, a Certificate of Insurance evidencing such coverage, satisfactory to County, shall be furnished to County, which shall specifically state that such insurance shall provide for at least ten (10) days' notice to County in the event of cancellation, termination or any change in such insurance policies. The workers compensation certificate shall bear an endorsement clearly evidencing a waiver of the right of subrogation against County and County Representatives. Should Provider fail to furnish current evidence upon demand of any insurance required hereunder, or in the event of cancellation, termination or change in any such insurance, County may, at its option, suspend this Contract until insurance is obtained, terminate this Contract immediately without further action, or hold Provider in material default and pursue any and all remedies available. Said Certificate of Insurance evidencing the requisite coverage is attached hereto as Attachment D as if fully set forth.

XXVIII. Notice of Funding. The engineering project which is the subject of this Contract is 100% funded by the COUNTY.

Scope & Fee Proposal

Gresham Smith is pleased to submit this revised proposal for designing intersection improvements and access management for the intersection of County Road 13 and Corte Road in Baldwin County. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The design of the roundabout will be based on the Baldwin County RFQ as well as notes from the scoping meeting held with Baldwin County staff on January 15, 2025. 


<u>Wetlands Mapping and Permitting</u> - Wetland Sciences, as a subconsultant to Gresham Smith, will perform a wetlands assessment of the site and delineate and map any wetlands found within the construction limits of the project. A cultural resources assessment is not anticipated for this project and is not included in the scope.

Preliminary Design

- Kickoff Meeting with Baldwin County Gresham Smith will attend a project kickoff meeting with Baldwin County. The
 overall goals of this meeting are to confirm that we understand the problem that we are working to solve, the County's

Gresham Smith will contract with subconsultant Southeastern Surveying and Mapping Corporation to perform topographic, utility and right of way/property surveys for the project.

Topographic Survey - A topographic survey will be performed for the CR-13 existing alignment and the existing Corte Road and Glover Lane. The topographic survey will include the area outside the existing R.O.W. that are anticipated to be impacted by the construction of the roundabout and the approaches. The survey will include the location of all existing improvements, existing overhead utilities, existing underground utilities (gas, power, telecommunications, fiber optic, etc.) as located and marked by others, any water distribution system, accessible sanitary sewer structures, accessible storm structures, and drainage features. The surveyor will call the Alabama 811 locating service to have all in place underground utilities marked. The surveyor will provide a plat of the survey with all improvements, utility information, and topography shown at 1-foot contour intervals. The surveyor will also provide a digital version of the survey and/or a digital surface model in OpenRoads Designer format to be used for engineering design.

Right of Way/Property Survey- The surveyor will perform a R.O.W. survey in order to establish the existing R.O.W. and verify the existing property corners and R.O.W. monuments, property owners, establishment of existing right-of-way, and existing easements in the project area.

<u>Acquired Right of Way Field Map-</u> Once the R.O.W. to be acquired has been established in the design process, a map will be provided to Baldwin County that shows the existing R.O.W. and property information as well as the R.O.W. to be acquired.

Geotechnical and Pavement Design Services – Geotechnical Engineering-Testing, Inc. (GET), as a subconsultant to Gresham Smith, will perform a geotechnical subsurface exploration to develop recommendations for earthwork as well as for pavement design. GET will perform 6' borings at 200' intervals in the area of the proposed roundabout and lane widening. A report will be prepared that will summarize findings from the soil analysis and provide recommendations with regards to roadway foundation and fill materials. The report will also include recommendations for the new the pavement structure and tieing to the existing roads.

Roadway Plans

Gresham Smith will design and prepare roadway plans for this project in accordance with current ALDOT standards. We currently propose to prepare plans at a 1" =30' scale due to the level and amount of detail needed to be shown in the plans. All sheets will be developed with the current ALDOT CADD Standards and the latest versions of the ALDOT Roadway Plans Preparation Manual and the ALDOT Standard Drawings. The plans will be developed in the current ALDOT-approved version of OpenRoads Designer. Baldwin County will be provided electronic plan submittals for this project. Lighting Layout - Using the desired lighting fixture provided by Baldwin County or the local electrical provider, Gresham Smith will perform a photometric analysis and develop a layout of the lighting fixtures for the roundabout. This layout will be provided to Baldwin County or the local electrical provider, and the County or electrical provider will provide the design of the electrical system (power service, conductors, conduits, foundations, etc.).

Gresham Smith will prepare a Storm Water Construction Best Management Practices Plan (CBMPP) and ADEM Construction Stormwater Permit Application.

Gresham Smith will prepare an Engineer's construction cost estimate for the entire project, utilizing unit cost information provided by Baldwin County and ALDOT.

<u>Utility Coordination</u> – Gresham Smith will provide utility coordination with affected utility companies. Our utility coordination effort is largely controlled by the utility companies' responsiveness to our coordination submittals and completing their relocation designs and relocation agreements in a timely manner. We have included our best estimate of our utility coordination effort needed to submit plans to the utility companies, confirm areas where relocations are required, confirm areas where utilities can be placed, determine if additional Right of Way will be required for relocations, and obtain utility relocation plans and agreements from affected utility companies. If we experience delays with the utility coordination work that results in us reaching our estimated utility relocation fee amount, we will request additional funding to complete the utility coordination work at that time.

Our utility coordination scope includes:

- A. Review survey of ROW and existing utilities as overlaid on proposed roadway improvements to identify potential utility conflicts and relocations needed.
- B. After plan milestone submittals at 60% and 90%, meet with utility companies and County to discuss utility relocations needed, preferred location of utilities and installation methods if conflicts exist.
- C. Meet with affected utility companies to outline a path forward for each. Outline dates for utility companies to respond to conflicts (will coincide with scheduled project progress meetings).
- D. The design of utility relocations will be the responsibility of and provided by the affected utility company.

<u>Plan Reviews</u> – Gresham Smith anticipates that a total of three (3) plan review meetings, one (1) for 30% complete, one (1) for 60% complete & one (1) for 90% complete, with Baldwin County will be held for the project. Gresham Smith will inculde dispositions of the comments made on the plans during these review meetings.

Per our discussion, the following is our proposed scope of services and estimated costs necessary to secure the required wetland resource permits for the proposed bridge replacement located in Baldwin County, Alabama. This proposal includes a review of furnished project information, presents our proposed scope of services, and contains deliverables and fee information.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Activities to be performed for the Scope of Work are broken into two tasks to include fieldwork, coordination with designers, and preparation of an Application for Department of the Army Permit and agency negotiations, as described above.

TASK 1 - FIELD WORK

- 1. A jurisdictional determination of all wetlands regulated under 33 CFR 320-330 (US Army Corps of Engineers in accordance with the Corps of Engineers 1987 wetland delineation manual). This effort will involve members of our staff to first conduct a non-binding jurisdictional determination in which WSI staff will identify all wetland resources and provide a written narrative describing our findings. In addition, Wetland Sciences, Inc. will locate the jurisdictional lines using a Differentially Corrected Global Positioning System (DGPS), which is submeter accurate. This data can be overlain onto aerial photographs, imported electronically into an AutoCAD drawing of the property survey, or used to generate an AutoCAD drawing with the parcel's boundaries approximated which will be attached to the report. This will assist survey crews in the location of the delineated boundary lines.
- Review land uses and vegetation types, as well as those citing habitat preferences for rare, threatened and species of special concern, and identify any specific areas within the project area that could possibly support listed species. The study will be based on a Land Use, Cover and Forms Classification System (FLUCFCS) and will focus on habitats that could potentially support state or federally listed species or species of special concern. Surveys will be based on visual and audible detection methodologies as outlined within the FGFWFC manual entitled, Wildlife Methodology Guidelines for Section 18.D of the Application for Development Approval, 1988.

Submission or distribution of documents to meet official regulatory requirements or for similar purposes in connection with the Project is not to be construed as publication inconsistent with our reserved rights.

TERMINATION

Either party may terminate the Agreement if the other party materially breaches the Agreement. You shall immediately pay SSMC for our services rendered and expenses incurred through the termination date, including fees and expenses that SSMC incur as a result of the termination,

Neither party shall assign or transfer any rights, interests or claims arising under this Agreement without the written consent of the other. This Agreement shall not confer any benefit or right upon any person or entity other than you, SSMC, and its officers, employees, agents, and subcontractors. SSMC's officers, employees, agents, and subcontractors shall have and shall be entitled to the protections afforded SSMC under this Agreement.

GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement shall be interpreted under and governed by the laws of the State of Florida. The parties agree that the courts of Orange County, Florida, and the US District Court of the Middle District of Florida (Orlando Division) shall have exclusive jurisdiction over any controversy. The parties consent to the jurisdiction of the Courts and waive any objection either party might otherwise be entitled to assert regarding jurisdiction. The parties irrevocably waive all right to trial by jury in any action, proceeding, or counterclaim arising out of or related to this Agreement.

If any part, term, or provision of this agreement is held to be illegal or unenforceable, the validity and enforceability of the remaining parts, terms, and provisions of this agreement shall not be affected, and each party's rights shall be construed and enforced as if the agreement did not contain the illegal or unenforceable part, term, or provision.

LIMITATIONS ON LIABILITY

SSMC's liability for any loss, property damage or bodily injury of or to you caused in whole or in part by SSMC in the performance of this Agreement, or in the performance of any supplementary services in any way related to this Agreement, shall be limited in the aggregate to the amount of fees that you have paid to SSMC for the Services. The parties intend that the preceding limitation on liability shall apply to all slaims, whether sounding in tort, in contract, in warranty or otherwise. You release, waive, and shall not seek contribution from, or indemnification by, SSMC for any claims of any nature made against you by any other person who may suffer any loss, property damage or bodily injury in any manner associated with SSMC's services, or SSMC's officers, employees, agents and subcontractors under this Agreement, or any supplementary services in any way related to this Agreement. SSMC shall not be liable to you, in any event or for any amount, for delays, or consequential, special or incidental damages; or punitive or exemplary damages.

PAYMENT OF ATTORNEY'S FEES

The losing party shall pay the winning party's reasonable attorney's fees and expenses for the prosecution or defense of any cause of action, claim or demand arising under this Agreement in any court or in arbitration.

You agree to Indemnify and hold SSMC harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, damages, claims, and demands for loss, damages, property damages or bodily injury, arising out of work undertaken on the Project by you, or your contractor, subcontractor or other independent company or consultant employed by you to work on the Project, or their respective partners, members, managers, directors, officers, employees, agents or assigns; or arising out of any other operation, no matter by whom performed, for and on behalf of you, or such contractor, subcontractor or other independent company or consultant, whether or not due in part to errors or omissions by us in the performance of this Agreement, or in the performance of any supplementary service in any way related to this Agreement, provided that you are not required to indemnify and hold SSMC harmless under this Paragraph in the event of SSMC's sole negligence.

INSURANCE

SSMC represents that it carries and will continue carry General Liability in the amount of \$1M per each occurrence and \$2M per general aggregate, Worker's Compensation in the amount of \$1M, Automobile Liability in the amount of \$1M, Professional Liability also known as Errors and Omissions in the amount of \$5M per occurrence and general aggregate, and Umbrella Coverage in the amount of \$5M. General Liability, Automobile Liability and Worker's Compensation are primary and non-contributory with Umbrella following form. Certificates of Insurance shall be provided upon request, listing your Company as the certificate holder for a period of one (1) year. SSMC and Client shall waive subrogation against one another.

COMPLETE AGREEMENT

This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties concerning the matters covered herein. No prior representations, statements, or inducements made by either SSMC, you, or the respective agents of either, that is not contained in the Agreement shall enlarge, modify, alter, or otherwise vary the written terms of the Agreement unless they are made in writing and made a part of the Agreement by attachment, incorporated by reference in the Agreement or signed or initialed on behalf of both parties.

This clause shall not be construed to prevent PROVIDER from making and distributing maps, brochures etc., which are derived from data from COUNTY pursuant to this agreement.
- 3. Any information or content contained either within COUNTY's internet mapping viewer or within this digital data distributed by the COUNTY is derived from a variety of public and private sources considered to be dependable, but the accuracy, completeness and currency thereof is not guaranteed. The COUNTY makes no warranties, expressed or implied, as to the accuracy, completeness, currency, reliability, or suitability for any particular purpose of such information or data contained in or generated from the COUNTY Geographic Database or otherwise. Additionally, the COUNTY or any agent, servant or employee thereof assumes no liability associated with the use of this data, and assumes no responsibility to maintain it in any manner or form.
- 4. PROVIDER agrees that all materials publicizing or resulting from GIS Data provided for by the Agreement shall contain an acknowledgement of the COUNTY's assistance with said acknowledgement of support made through the use of the following or comparable footnote: "This activity was supported by the Baldwin County Commission."
- 5. Digital data will be provided in ArcView shape files and *.tif and *.jpg image formats.
- GIS data provided to PROVIDER are in Alabama State Plane West, NAD83, FIPSZONE 0102. Vertical datasets are in the NAVD88 datum. Units are US Survey Feet.
- 7. PROVIDER agrees that if the project is terminated, then the "master" GIS dataset will be removed and destroyed. PROVIDER may continue to use any value added data that resides on its network that has been incorporated into their business applications after the termination of the agreement.
- 8. It is understood and agreed by the parties that all proprietary restrictions pertaining to the Digital GIS Data contained herein shall survive the termination of the Contract.
