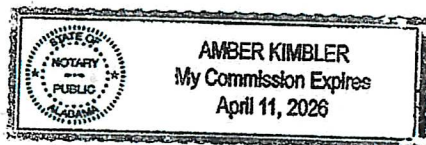

Fairhope AL 36532, and will be considered pursuant to Alabama Code Section 45-2-261.

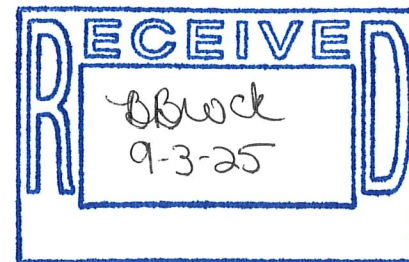

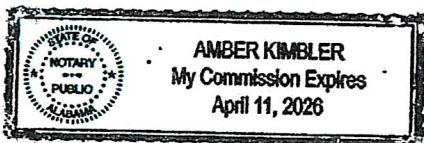
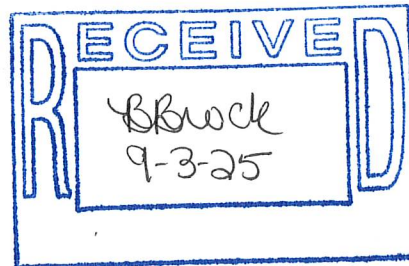

An estimated 7,400 gallons of stormwater and untreated wastewater spilled from a sanitary sewer manhole in a ditch near the lift station. Officials said some of that flow traveled approximately 700 feet to Wolf Creek.

The Utilities Board reported the incident to the Alabama Department of Environmental Management and the Baldwin County Health Department on Aug. 24. The board said it is considering raising manholes in the area to help prevent future stormwater intrusion.

"We urge residents to exercise caution when using these associated bodies of water for recreational purposes, thoroughly cook any fish or seafood caught in these areas, and thoroughly wash their hands after handling any fish or seafood from these areas," the board said in the release.

The Utilities Board emphasized it responds to sewer overflows in line with state and federal standards. No public water supply intakes were affected by the incident.

Saturday's incident marks the fourth large sanitary sewer overflow in Baldwin County in about a month. A previous overflow in Foley and one in Fairhope were both cited to have happened due to severe weather, while another in Foley was linked to damage from a separate utility company.

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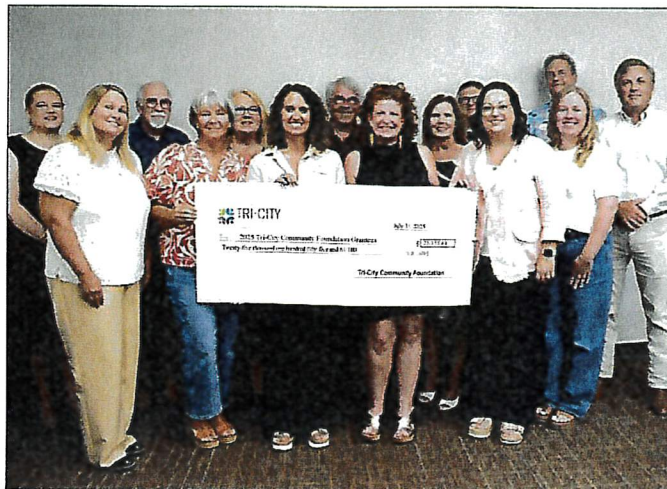

The Dream Center of Baldwin County has received funding from the Tri-City Community Foundation, an affiliate of The Community Foundation of South Alabama, to support a local student through its youth development program.

The award will cover the full cost for one student from Foley, Gulf Shores or Orange Beach to participate in the Dream Center program,

which provides mentoring and education to at-risk teens ages 12-18, according to a news release.

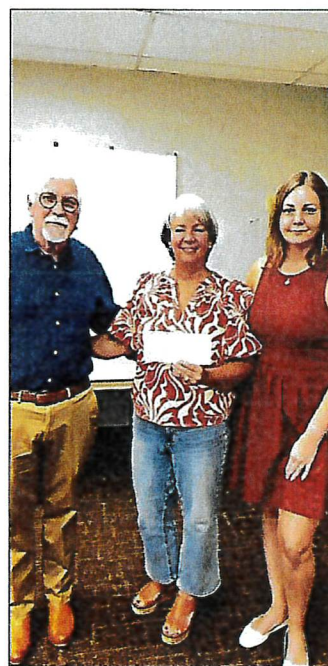

Founded in Foley, the Dream Center works with area schools, families and the juvenile justice system to help break cycles of abuse, victimization and criminality. The nonprofit provides tools and guidance aimed at preparing youth for long-term success.

After moving to Foley in 2013, Dayton became an active resident, serving as president, vice president and chairman of the architectural review committee for the Lake View Estates Property Owners Association.

He also volunteered with South Baldwin Medical Center, according to the city's website, the City of Dayton's statement.

Dayton graduated from the University of Cincinnati with a bachelor's degree in marketing and accounting and later earned an MBA at Regent University. He also received several certifications in franchise development and business brokerage.
