





An estimated 7,400 gallons of stormwater and untreated wastewater spilled from a sanitary sewer manhole in a ditch near the lift station. Officials said some of that flow

The Utilities Board reported the incident to the Ala-bama Department of Environmental Management and the Baldwin County Health Department on Aug. 24. The board said it is considering raising manholes in the area to help prevent future stormwater intrusion.

to help prevent future stormwater intrusion.

"We urge residents to exercise caution when using these associated bodies of water for recreational purposes, thoroughly cook any fish or seafood caught in these areas, and thoroughly wash their hands after handling any fish or seafood from these areas," the board said in the release. The Utilities Board emphasized it responds to sewer overflows in line with state and federal standards. No public water supply intakes were affected by the incident. Saturday's incident mark the fourth hore certifiers.

Saturday's incident marks the fourth large sanitary sewer overflow in Baldwin County in about a month. A previous overflow in Foley and one in Fairhope were both cited to have happened due to severe weather, while an-other in Foley was linked to damage from a separate utility company.
