Dear Mayor Karin Wilson and Council President Jack Burrell:

Our office of Probate has received two petitions from registered voters of the City of Fairhope. The signatures of both petitions have been verified by election officials of our office.

The first petition received June 30, 2018, had 188 verified signatures. This petition did not receive enough registered signatures required under the Alabama Code to call for a special election.

The second petition was received on July 5, 2018, and had 803 verified signatures. This number qualifies to call for a special election in the City. Attached is a copy of the language used in the petition.

By the powers granted to me as Judge of Probate of Baldwin County, I call for your City to set an election date no earlier than 40 days nor no later than 90 days from July 5, 2018.

We strongly encourage you to coordinate with our office in selecting a date for the election which works well for your citizens and the election officials of the city and our office. Alabama statutes require the cost of the election to be paid by the city. Our estimated costs of the election are \$15,000. All county and Probate costs will be itemized and available for audit by members of your staff.
