

Management Control Agreement

This Management Control Agreement (Agreement) is made by and between the Baldwin County Commission (BCC) and the Baldwin County Sheriff's Office. The Baldwin County Commission and the Baldwin County Sheriff's Office (collectively referred to as "parties") hereby acknowledge and agree as follows:

WHEREAS, pursuant to the CJIS Security Policy Version 5.8, regarding the administration of that portion of computer systems and network infrastructure interfacing directly or indirectly with the state network ACJIC for the interstate exchange of criminal history/criminal justice information, the Baldwin County Sheriff's Office wishes to have the authority, via managed control, to set and enforce various matters; and

WHEREAS, the parties have reached an agreement pertaining to the computer systems and network infrastructure interfacing directly or indirectly with the state network ACJIC for the interstate exchange of criminal history/criminal justice information.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, and in relation to the overall supervision of all Baldwin County Sheriff's Office systems, applications, equipment, systems design, programming, and operational procedures associated with the development, implementation, and maintenance of any Baldwin County Sheriff's Office system to include NCIC Programs that may be subsequently designed and/or implemented within the Baldwin County Sheriff's Office, the sufficiency of all such consideration is hereby acknowledged, the parties do hereby agree as follows:

1. Managed Control by Baldwin County Sheriff's Office. Pursuant to the CJIS

Security Policy, it is agreed that with respect to administration of that portion of computer systems and network infrastructure interfacing directly or indirectly with the state network (ALEA CJNet) for the interstate exchange of criminal history/criminal justice information, the Baldwin County Sheriff's Office shall have the authority, via managed control, to set, maintain, and enforce:

- (1) Priorities.
- (2) Standards for the selection, supervision, and termination of personnel access to Criminal Justice Information (CJI).
- (3) Policy governing operation of justice systems, computers, access devices, circuits, hubs, routers, firewalls, and any other components, including encryption) that comprise and support a telecommunications network and related criminal justice systems to include but not limited to criminal history record/criminal justice information, insofar as the equipment is used to process or transmit criminal justice systems information guaranteeing the priority, integrity, and availability of service needed by the criminal justice community
- (4) Restriction of unauthorized personnel from access or use of equipment accessing the State network.
- (5) Compliance with all rules and regulations of the Baldwin County Sheriff's Office Court Policies and CJIS Security Policy in the operation of all information received.

" ... management control of the criminal justice function remains solely with the Criminal Justice Agency." Section 5.1.1.4

2. CJA Management & Control. Responsibility for management of security

control shall remain with the criminal justice agency. (See CJIS Security Policy Version 5.8).

3. Certain Authority. Notwithstanding anything written or implied within this Agreement, the Baldwin County Sheriffs' Office shall in no way have any authority to manage, set standards, set priorities, or otherwise control official policies relating to, without limitation, administrative, personnel, and computer information systems of the BCC and such attempt to do so will render this Agreement void.

4. No Agency Created. It is neither the express nor the implied

intent of the Baldwin County Sheriff's Office or the BCC to create an agency relationship pursuant to this Agreement; therefore, neither Party acts in any manner act on behalf of the other Party and the creation of such a relationship is prohibited and void.

5. Entire Agreement. This agreement represents the entire and integrated agreement between the BCC and the Baldwin County Sheriff's Office and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements, either written or oral. This agreement may be amended only by written instrument signed by all parties.

6. Effective Date & Termination. This Agreement shall be effective on the date of full execution. The BCC and the Baldwin County Sheriff's Office may terminate this contract, with or without cause or reason, by giving thirty (30) days written notice of such to the other party. Upon receipt of such notices, both parties shall discontinue their work to the extent specified in the notice.

7. Force Majeure. The Parties hereto shall incur no liability to the other if performance becomes impossible or impracticable by reason on an event or effect that the parties could neither have anticipated nor controlled. This allowance shall include both an act of nature and acts of third parties. Any costs that would otherwise be incurred and/or necessitated by the provisions herein shall be alleviated for either party by such event or effect.

8. State of Alabama. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in

accordance with the laws of the State of Alabama.

9. Indemnification. Baldwin County Sheriff's Office shall indemnify, defend and hold the BCC and its affiliates, employees, agents, representatives, contractors, subcontractors, licensees and invitees harmless from and against any and all claims, demands, liabilities, damages, losses, judgments, costs, and expenses including, without limitation, attorneys' fees, of any nature whatsoever, incurred by, asserted against, or imposed upon BCC.

10. Number of Originals. This Agreement shall be executed with any number of originals, all of which are equally valid as an original.

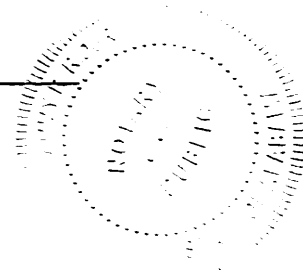
