

Baldwin County Commission Meeting

We currently provide healthcare to approximately 12,000 inmates in over sixty jails in six states. We serve facilities that range in size from small 20-bed municipal jails to large, multi-site detention facilities with 1,000 inmates. Per our founder & owner Dr. Johnny Bates, "Our mission is simple yet critical: To seamlessly integrate cost effective affordable and quality correctional health care into the corrections environment."

- October 2016, QCHC took over complete responsibility of all inmates here at BCSO
- We hired and trained all of the medical staff
- Our first major step was to get a complete physical assessment of all 580 inmates so that we could identify what kind of medical, dental, & mental health problems such as HTN, DM, Liver ds, kidney ds, etc. were being housed here at the jail. While doing that, we began seeing all inmates as they were booked in before they were sent back to their housing area.
- Our medical & jail staff here worked very hard examining all sick call request from the inmates within 24 hours so that we could catch any illnesses before they became crisis.

*Increased mental health increased
hours / no cost*

- Once all inmate physical assessments and sick calls were caught up, we then began seeing inmates with chronic conditions for Chronic Care follow ups for diseases such as DM, HTN, mental health, ETC. This allows us to follow inmates with these medical conditions to prevent medical crisis before they happen.
- Our medical team here at BCSO has & does utilize the infirmarium rooms to closely monitor inmates that are too ill to be with the other population but not ill enough to be in the hospital. In these rooms, we are able to give IV fluids for hydration, IV antibiotics for infections, and house high risk pregnant females close to delivery.
- When we came in 2016, we also brought in-house lab work, xrays, EKGs, and ultrasounds which not only decreased the cost of these test, but freed up transport security.
- Another service we are able to provide the inmates here at no cost to the county is rapid HIV testing, education, & follow up care.
- ~~Another~~ big savings to the county was utilizing a specific medication formulary developed by our physicians when ordering inmates medications
