





SEA TURTLES

3 species nest in Alabama from May-Oct: Kemp's ridley, loggerhead, and green sea turtles

It is illegal to disturb sea turtles, hatchlings, or nests. If you see a nesting, injured, or deceased sea turtle, please call 1-866-SEA-TURT **!**

Sea turtles are the last of ancient reptiles appearing in geologic records when dinosaurs roamed Earth.

MARINE MAMMALS

At least 28 species of marine mammals, like dolphins, whales, and manatees are found in the Gulf. They are often curious, but you must stay at least 50 yards away.

! It is illegal to touch, feed, or interact with marine mammals. For injured mammals, call 1-877-WHALE-HELP. For manatee sightings, call 1-866-493-5803.

FUN FACT! Dolphin dorsal fins are like fingerprints and can be used to identify individuals.
