

The Clerk/Treasurer said provided the Board of Education complies with the bid law, the Baldwin County Commission can make a donation to the Board of Education or Daphne Middle School as long as that donation does not exceed \$7,500 because of the bid law.

MOTION BY COMMISSIONER PERDUE, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER FAUST TO TURN THIS MATTER OVER TO THE CLERK/TREASURER AND COUNTY ATTORNEY FOR FURTHER REVIEW AND BRING BACK A RECOMMENDATION BEFORE THE COMMISSION AT THE NEXT BALDWIN COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING.

As a matter of information, the County Attorney informed the Commission that the School Board meets this Thursday night. He recommended the Commission provide the Board of Education with it's request to contribute up to \$7,000 toward construction of the outdoor classroom at the Daphne Middle School.

STANDARD FURNITURE

Commissioner Hansen said the Landfill has been servicing Standard Furniture Company by picking it up at the Transfer Station once it has been dumped there by BFI. Most of this waste is wood products. The waste is then hauled to Loxley or Magnolia Springs.

Standard Furniture has proposed the County not pick up waste at the Transfer Station but rather, roll off boxes and other containers will be delivered either by County trucks or Standard Furniture trucks to McBride Landfill. This would necessitate Baldwin County purchasing a 40 yard compactor type roll off box. This box would be rented to Standard Furniture for \$50 per month. Every time the box would be transported, there would be a \$65 charge to Standard Furniture. The Landfill charges would be \$12.50 per ton for this product at McBride Landfill.

MOTION BY COMMISSIONER HANSEN, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER MIDDLETON TO ALLOW THE LANDFILL TO FINISH THE NEGOTIATIONS AND AUTHORIZE THE CHAIRMAN TO SIGN A CONTRACT WITH STANDARD FURNITURE ONCE THE CONTRACT HAS BEEN REVIEWED BY THE COUNTY ATTORNEY. AND FURTHER, AUTHORIZE STAFF TO GO OUT FOR BID FOR A 40 CUBIC YARD ROLL OFF BOX. UNANIMOUS.
