





that to heart." At the Oct. 20 City Council work session, Blake Phelps, director of omic development and public affairs for Gulf Shores, presented a resolution for an agreement with OpenGov to implement the CRM proj-

He said currently a citizen can call any depart-ment at the city, which may result in the citizen being "passed around multiple departments" trying to get to the correct person for the issue. Residents also have the option to fill out a form on the "Report a Concern" page on the city website, which often re-sults in a similar process as concerns go to specific department channels and might be shared among several departments before it is fixed.

Councilman Jason
Dyken said CRM would
serve as a city accountability tool as multiple departments will be able to track responses to issues and ensure residents are helped.

"I think this system is very much needed," he said. "We try to answer all complaints, but as we've grown in staffing and departments and re-sponsibilities, sometimes,

issues do get lost."

He said he thought the project would likely present a learning curve but would ultimately prove to be a move in a good di-

rection.
Councilman Philip Harris said on CRM, "I think this provides another channel for the public to make comments. I think another thing we heard fover the election] is not

come to these meetings, not everybody is comfortable coming to that microphone, but here's an opportunity from your home, from your computer to get online and log an issue or concern and hopefully we hear more than we're hearing now.' PREVIOUS COUNCIL

Earlier this year, City Council approved a three-year contract with Open-Gov to implement enterprise asset management (EAM) for public works and recreation staff members to track work orders and activities.

By working with Open-Gov to implement the CRM, resident requests will go straight to the EAM internal work order

system database. Phelps said, "So, we've got a seamless flow of receiving that information, receiving that question or that concern, logging it into the system, it being assigned to the correct person, then a work order actually being created and that issue being

er action needs to be

Like the EAM agreement, the OpenGov con-tract for CRM will be for three years. Phelps said the city's IT department has volunteered a little over \$44,000 from their budget for the initial cost so the city can start im-plementing the project, rather than waiting for

the next fiscal year.

He said the city will balance the budget for the next three years to pay about \$30,000 per year. The total cost of the contract is \$138,213.39.

According to the agenda item, the estimated implementation timeline for CRM is four to five months. If approved by Gulf Shores Council at their Oct. 27 meeting, which is after press time, the city is set to launch the product near the end of the first quarter of next year.
