relocations and construction.

<u>CM1</u> - Tara Hazelbaker, Finance Director, explained the revisions to Policy 8.21 are needed to clean up verbiage and remove geographic restrictions regarding investments. She noted a request for proposals is forthcoming to evaluate options for excess cash reserves.
