BALDWIN COUNTY LOCAL EMERGENCY PLANNING COMMITTEE (LEPC)

General Information:

Baldwin County LEPC was created by Baldwin County Resolution dated 09/15/1987 for the purpose of compliance with the Public Law 99-499, the Superfund Amendment and Reauthorization of Act of 1986 (SARA).

SARA 1986, Subtitle A - Emergency Planning and Notification, Section 103, states that the committee shall include at a minimum, representatives from each of the following groups or organizations: elected State and local officials, law enforcement, civil defense, firefighting, first aid, health, local environmental, hospital, and transportation personnel, broadcast and print media, community group and owners and operators of facilities subject to the requirements of this subtitle.

The Baldwin County Emergency Management Agency will serve as office of record for LEPC.

Chairperson shall be elected by a majority vote of the LEPC members and recommended by the BCC for appointment.

All elected members shall serve a term of three (3) years and may serve consecutive terms.
