Job Summary

Performs highly responsible and diverse professional civil engineering tasks and assists the Assistant County Engineer in directing a major department of county government. The employee is responsible for overseeing and directing the three area maintenance sections, Maintenance Engineering Section, Construction Section and Paving Crew Traffic Operations Section of the Baldwin County Highway Department. The employee determines and recommends major departmental policies, plans long-term programs, and makes administrative decisions consistent with county policies relative to maintenance, construction and engineering activities.

Job Domains

A. Engineering - As Directed by Assistant County Engineer

1. Render professional engineering advice/assistance to professional and supervisory staff in implementation of public works Construction/Maintenance projects and activities.

- 2. Direct professional, sub-professional and other employees engaged in.
 Construction/Maintenance of all public roads, highways, bridges and related drainage structures and other governmental activities
- 3. Establish maintenance priorities necessary to conform to good engineering practice as related to local, state, and federal specifications and requirements, as required.
- 4. Oversee Construction, Maintenance, Rehabilitation and Alteration projects accomplished by Baldwin County forces.
- Professional contact with outside survey, engineering, construction, or other
 miscellaneous service-oriented providers for the purposes of obtaining services, negotiate
 contracts for services, administering contracts and ensuring prosecution of work by
 contractors or consultants.

B. Planning and Coordinating

- 1. Liaison with citizens for coordinating various other agencies.
- 2. Plan and schedule Specialized Highway Construction/Maintenance activities.
- 3. Assist in developing budget.
- 4. Assign work to subordinates and leads subordinates in accomplishing goals and priorities.
- 5. Hold subordinates accountable to achieving desired goals.
- 6. Inspect road and bridges scheduled for Construction/Maintenance work.

C. Miscellaneous

- 1. Read literature and attends formal training to improve knowledge and skills for both immediate and long-term application to the job.
- 2. Attend seminars and conference related to job domains
- 3. Must be highly motivated and organized.
