1 SB367 2 3 With Notice and Proof 4 5 ENROLLED, An Act, 6 Relating to Baldwin County; to amend Section 7 45-2-244.183, Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide for the 8 distribution of the privilege license tax on the leasing or 9 renting of tangible personal property; to amend Section 10 45-2-220.05, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the 11 distribution of certain additional recording fees; to provide 12 that the portion of the additional recording fee distributed 13 to the county legislative delegation office would be 14 redistributed to the Baldwin County District Attorney's 15 Office; and to provide retroactive effect. 16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 17 Section 1. Section 45-2-244.183, Code of Alabama 18 1975, is amended to read as follows: 19 "§45-2-244.183. 20 "(a) The privilege license tax levied hereunder, 21 except where otherwise provided, shall be due and payable in 22 monthly installments on or before the twentieth day of the 23 month next succeeding the month in which the privilege license 24 tax accrues. On or before such twentieth day, every person on 25

whom the amounts levied hereunder are imposed shall render to 1 the county, on a form or forms prescribed by the county 2 commission or State Department of Revenue, a true and correct 3 statement showing the gross proceeds of his or her business 4 for the next preceding month, the amount of gross proceeds 5 which are not subject to the privilege license tax, or are not 6 to be used as a measurement of the amounts due by such person 7 and the nature thereof, together with such other information 8 as the county commission may require, and at the time of 9 making such monthly report such person shall compute the 10 privilege license taxes due and shall pay the Baldwin County 11 Commission the amounts shown to be due. All taxes of the 12 county shall be deposited into the general fund of the county 13 treasury to be distributed as follows: 14

"(1) Seventy-five percent shall be distributed to 15 the county general fund to be expended, as approved by the 16 Baldwin County Commission, for general purposes; however, and 17 per fiscal year from the foregoing distribution, the Baldwin 18 County Commission shall appropriate two hundred thousand 19 dollars (\$200,000) into a separate county fund to be used for 20 the operation of the Baldwin County Legislative Office, 21 established by Section 45-2-190, including, but not limited 22 to, office equipment, communication equipment, salary 23 supplements for personnel of the legislative delegation 24 office, training, and official public travel for House and 25

Senate members of the Baldwin County Legislative Delegation 1 and personnel of the legislative delegation office and other 2 expenses deemed appropriate only by written direction provided 3 the Baldwin County Commission by the House and Senate members 4 of the Baldwin County Legislative Delegation. The members and 5 personnel of the office may be eligible for reimbursement 6 where applicable under the same policies, procedures, and 7 conditions as county elected officials as provided in County 8 Commission Policy No. 8.6 and subsequent policies. All of the 9 policies shall be subject to the same audit provisions as 10 provided for the office. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the 11 expenses for official travel by a member of the House of 12 Representatives representing Baldwin County outside of his or 13 her district shall not exceed two thousand dollars (\$2,000) 14 per House of Representatives member per during a county fiscal 15 year, shall be subject to a majority vote of the House 16 delegation, and shall be subject to periodic audits by the 17 Examiners of Public Accounts. Expenses for official travel by 18 a member of the Senate representing Baldwin County outside of 19 his or her district shall not exceed seven thousand five 20 hundred dollars (\$7,500) per Senator during a county fiscal 21 year and shall be subject to periodic audits by the Examiners 22 of Public Accounts. 23 "(2) Ten <u>Twelve</u> percent shall be distributed into a 24

25 separate county fund to be expended, as approved by the

Baldwin County Commission in a resolution spread upon its 1 minutes, for the Historic Blakeley Authority. Of the funds 2 distributed to the Historic Blakeley Authority annually, 3 twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) shall be expended by 4 the authority for the preservation, restoration, and 5 interpretation of Fort Mims and of the remaining funds 50 6 percent shall be expended for capital improvement. 7 Notwithstanding the foregoing earmarking of expenditures for 8 the Historic Blakeley Authority for capital outlay, in any 9 fiscal year that the authority adds to and supplements its 10 lease tax revenue with contributions of capital expansion 11 funds or other equivalent capital contributions of real or 12 personal property from other sources, an amount of funds from 13 this section earmarked for capital outlay equal to 50 percent 14 of the additional contributions for capital outlay or 15 equivalent capital contributions may be expended for 16 operations in lieu of expending for capital outlay. 17Disbursements shall be made quarterly to the Historic Blakeley 18 Authority. for historic sites in Baldwin County as follows: At 19 least ten percent shall be expended for the Historic Blakeley 20 Authority and up to two percent shall be expended for other 21 historic sites in Baldwin County. The Baldwin County 22 Commission shall produce a report annually for the House and 23 Senate members of the Baldwin County Legislative Delegation 24 detailing the disbursement of these funds. 25

"(3) Fifteen percent shall be distributed into the 1 Baldwin County Community Capital Fund, which is hereby 2 established, to be expended only upon the unanimous direction 3 of the members of the Baldwin County Legislative Delegation 4 and for public purposes, not otherwise provided for by law, 5 that in their judgment are worthy, for the best interest of 6 the county, and promote the economic well-being of the 7 citizens of Baldwin County and may specifically include 8 projects at the Fort Morgan State Historic Site. Any 9 unexpended balance in the fund at the end of the county fiscal 10 vear shall remain in the fund and shall not revert to any 11 other state or local fund. 12 "(3) Eight percent shall be distributed to the 13 Baldwin County Economic Development Alliance for the purposes 14 of growing and improving the county's economy. 15 "(4) The remaining balance in the fund at the end of 16the county fiscal year shall revert to the Baldwin County 17 Legislative Delegation Office established by Section 45-2-190, 18 to be expended as provided in subdivision (1) in addition to 19 20 any other sums provided. "(4) (5) Privilege or license taxes collected and 21 expended under authority of this subpart shall be audited by 22 the Examiners of Public Accounts. 23

24 "(b) If any person subject hereto should fail to
25 render any report, return, statement, or form required hereby

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or should willfully make false statement of facts in the report, return, statement, or form required hereunder, he or she shall upon conviction be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500) for each violation of this section."

6 Section 2. Section 45-2-220.05, Code of Alabama 7 1975, is amended to read as follows:

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"§45-2-220.05.

"(a) In Baldwin County, there is levied an 9 additional recording fee of three dollars (\$3), and the 10 Baldwin County Commission may impose, by resolution of the 11 county commission, an additional recording fee not to exceed 12 two dollars (\$2), which shall be charged and collected on each 13 instrument, unless the instrument is otherwise exempt from all 14 fees filed for record in the office of the judge of probate. 15 The office of the judge of probate shall not receive an 16 instrument, unless the instrument is otherwise exempt from the 17 payment of a filing fee, for filing unless the filing fee 18 required by this part is paid. The fees required by this part 19 shall be in addition to all other fees provided by law. 20

"(b) One dollar (\$1) from each three dollar (\$3)
additional recording fee collected shall be deposited by the
county commission in a special fund established in a bank
located in Baldwin County to be used for the purpose of
establishing, operating, and maintaining the county

1 legislative delegation office. Disbursements from the fund 2 shall be made by the county commission only upon direction of 3 a majority of the members of the county legislative delegation 4 who reside in Baldwin County. Any unexpended balance in the 5 fund at the end of the county fiscal year shall remain in the 6 fund and shall not revert to any other state or local fund. 7 Starting with the 2000 fiscal year budget, the county 8 commission may make such appropriations as it deems necessary 9 from time to time from the county general fund to the special 10 fund for the county legislative delegation office distributed 11 to the Baldwin County District Attorney's Office. 12 "(c) The operation of the act adding this amendatory language shall be retroactive to June 1, 2000, and all action 13 14 taken and payments made pursuant to the act adding this 15 amendatory language on and after that date are ratified and

16 <u>confirmed.</u>

17 "(c) (d) Fees collected under this part shall be 18 audited by the Examiners of Public Accounts."

Section 3. This act shall be effective October 1,
 20 2019, following its passage and approval by the Governor, or
 21 its otherwise becoming law.
