

Preferred Requirements of No Fee & Fee Based Campsites –

1. Only large enough for two tents or 6 hammocks
2. For use up to two days
3. For no more than 6 people – though several welcome Scout groups
4. Preferably that only the private landowner can drive to
5. Preferably with a fire ring – or to know no fires are permitted
6. Every 8 to 10 miles
7. For free use or fee use
8. **We list fee based campsites, RV parks, B&B's, and a VFW**
9. Most places want a sign – it indicates a legitimate place to sleep

ASRT will provide

1. Free listing on our website - www.ASRT.me – and any restrictions you wish
2. Free ASRT sign that says “Please Leave It Better Than You Found It”
3. Another sign on the post, where appropriate, that says
“National Recreational Trail” (NRT) and/or “National Water Trail” (NWT)
4. A specific sign with your name if you wish to also be a **Trail Angel**

For Safety and trip planning, we wish to put this on our website

1. Latitude and Longitude of the specific place
2. Mileage position from known navigable start of that waterway
3. If fire ring present and if a campfire is permissible
4. Contact information of landlord, if okay to put
5. Picture from a water view for recognition
6. ‘R’ if on right bank or ‘L’ if on left bank

ASRT (1) is one of only 13 NWT's and of 3,000 NRT's (as of 2018) in the world
(2) has 56 waterways totaling nearly 6,000 miles – goal is to have 600 sites
(3) has 134 ‘campsites’ on website & 97 to add
(4) has had no complaints in 10 years at any campsite (as of March 2017)
(5) does not encourage trespass
(6) provides the location information online for emergency squads
(7) paddlers can plan their overnight trips using this advance information
