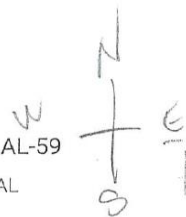

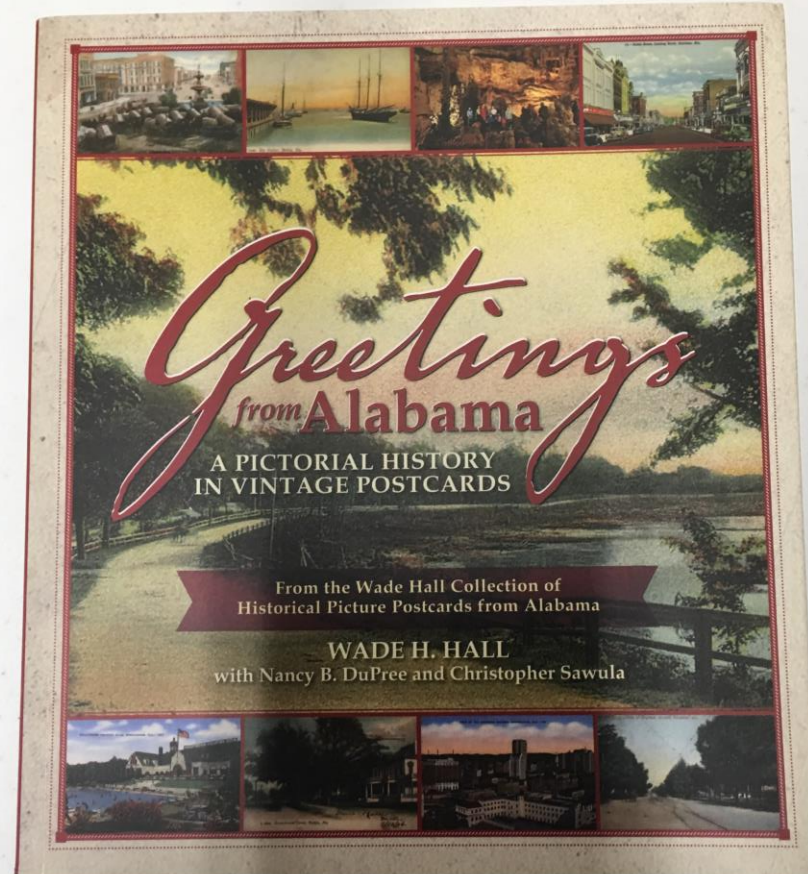

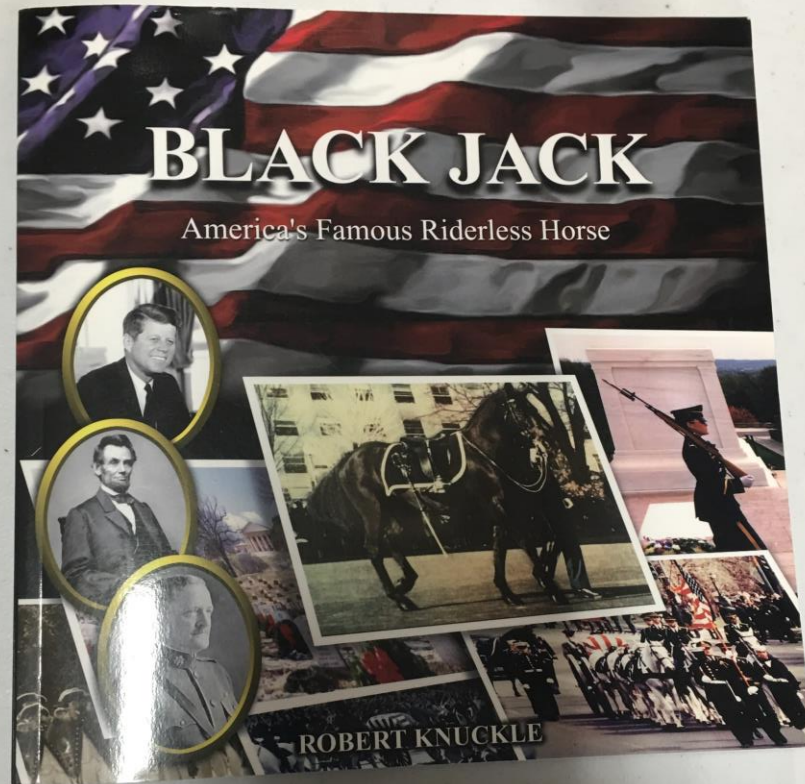

Arthur Carlson: Was born in Foley, grew up in Robertsedale, a veteran and son of Baldwin County, joined the Army at 18 and was assigned to Fort Meade, Virginia and the Cassion Unit which provides horses for funeral processions at Arlington National Cemetery.
