Ms. Hannah Whitson appeared before the Commission to accept the proclamation as presented by Commissioner Gruber on behalf of the Commission.

Commissioner Gruber asked Ron Cink, County Administrator/Budget Director, to read the proclamation. Commissioner Gruber thanked Ms. Whitson for accepting the proclamation.

Ms. Whitson read a prepared statement.

Commissioner Gruber thanked Ms. Whitson for attending today's meeting.

Commissioner Dorsey thanked Ms. Whitson for attending today's meeting and said it is unfortunate she has to know all of those medical terms so well. He appreciates her courage in coming today. Commissioner Dorsey said he appreciates Ms. Whitson's mother, Ms. Brandy Robertson's work in bringing Dysautonomia to the Commissioners' attention and sharing the word about this condition. He wishes God's blessings on Ms. Robertson and her family.

Commissioner Elliott said he has the benefit of knowing Ms. Robertson and she is an amazing advocate for Ms. Whitson and for every child out there who is facing this. Ms. Robertson has done amazing work and he thanks her.

Commissioner Gruber thanked Ms. Whitson for coming today and allowing the Commissioners to be able to inform citizens what this is about. He knows it is hard for Ms. Whitson and Ms. Robertson. A lot of times, this goes undetected and no one knows what it is until they are diagnosed with it. There is no cure, only medication to help. Commissioner Gruber said he appreciates Ms. Whitson's heart in informing the public about this.

Chairman Burt said staff helped with the pronunciation of the words by providing a "cheat sheet." He had never heard of Dysautonomia until the Commission passed a resolution for it last year. He is certain there are many in the County who are not aware of this, but this is the opportunity to bring this before the Commissioners and have it broadcast out to the people. Chairman Burt encouraged the public to look this word up if they do not know what it is to have a better understanding of what is going on in people's lives. Chairman Burt encouraged everyone to keep those affected by this in prayer because God knows the way. Some day, a cure can be found for this. Chairman Burt thanked Ms. Whitson and Ms. Robertson for coming to inform the public about this disease.

Commissioner Elliott said Ms. Whitson and Ms. Robertson have some people with them. He asked if they would introduce everyone.

Ms. Robertson appeared before the Commission and said this year, Dysautonomia International posted a Facebook message about this. Ms. Robertson said she was able to request both the RSA Towers in Mobile and Montgomery to be lit up in recognition of Dysautonomia. There will be

a lighting event held this Friday at the RSA Tower in Mobile where photographs will be taken. Ms. Robertson said after speaking with the President of Dysautonomia International, she was told that because of the chatter that has been raised, there is more going on in Alabama this month than in California. As a parent and advocate, she feels proud the entire State has been covered. Baldwin County has done its duty by offering the proclamation and she appreciates it. Ms. Robertson introduced Mr. Ethan Butler and said Mr. Butler is a Postural Orthostatic Tachycardia Syndrome (POTS) patient and he battles with Complex Regional Pain just like Ms. Whitson. When Ms. Whitson was first diagnosed, Mr. Butler's mom walked Ms. Robertson through what to do regarding the Complex Regional Pain because she did not know what to do and local doctors did not understand what it was.

Ms. Nicki Banks appeared before the Commission and said she was recently diagnosed with Dysautonomia; however, she is unsure of what form she has just yet. Ms. Banks thanked the Commissioners for recognizing Dysautonomia.

Ms. Robertson said Dysautonomia International stepped up this year and held a senate meeting for POTS. A representative for Representative Bradley Byrne attended the meeting. Several senators have backed this and are looking for funding. A certain amount of funding is required to be given to Dysautonomia, new treatment plans and research were recently started. Ms. Robertson encouraged everyone to look up what Dysautonomia is and said Dysautonomia International has a wealth of information on its website.

Commissioner Dorsey thanked Ms. Robertson for her efforts and persistence and said she is the only person who could get the RSA Tower lit a certain color.

The Commission has been a huge partner to the Chamber and the citizens here. The Chamber is very proud of the Live Oak Landing project. The Commissioners worked many years on the project and the Chamber was a strong advocate for it and appreciates the work the Commissioners did. Ms. Davis said unfortunately, Chairman Burt had a conflict and was unable attend the breakfast and the Chamber wants to publicly thank him for his service and dedication for the many things he has done for the community over the years.

O COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

Commissioner Gruber said on October 9, 2018, when the Commissioners received the call to hold an emergency special meeting to open the shelter for evacuees from Florida during Hurricane Michael, this Commission acted quickly to authorize the use. The Commission stepped forward and was willing to do what it took to help the County's neighbors during a catastrophic event. Commissioner Gruber thanked the Commissioners for agreeing to open and fund the shelter. This could have been Baldwin County and the Commissioners have to look at things like this to make sure the County is there for its neighbors. Commissioner Gruber thanked staff for working to get this done. The State of Florida is supposed to refund any cost. He does not feel there was that much cost. Commissioner Gruber asked if the Commissioners would entertain a motion to forego those costs and let it be like it is. The State of Florida will have enough in taking care of all it has to take care of.

Commissioner Elliott said this morning, the Commission passed a resolution transmitting the Commissioners' request to the Governor's Office to approve the use of Gulf of Mexico Energy Security Act (GOMESA) funds to purchase a parcel of property on the Intracoastal Waterway for use as a very large boat ramp facility. This project has a broad base of support, but it is something this Commission has worked on for a long time to bring to fruition. Now is the appropriate time to advocate for this project's funding through the Governor's Office. Commissioner Elliott said for all the people who have called on a regular basis asking for the Commission to address this problem, the Commissioners have identified a piece of property, have had some conceptual site planning performed, and are in the process of doing the needed environmental due diligence on the property. Time is of the essence to secure funding from GOMESA Act of 2006 that resides in the Governor's Office. This is a precedent setting project in that it will be the first large-infusion of GOMESA funds in Coastal Alabama. Commissioner Elliott said that is one of the reasons there is a broad base of support, even from the other side of Mobile Bay because the County is paving the way on that. He encourages Mobile and Baldwin Counties' residents to contact the Governor's Office and encourage her to allocate these funds as soon as possible. There is a clock on this purchase agreement and the Commission wants to make sure it gets in under that timeframe to secure the property and move the project forward.

Chairman Burt said in an effort to assist the County's neighbors in Florida who had some needs that came through all of the proper channels and were in order, the Commission had to act quickly to answer the request for a need for a shelter. The Red Cross was there to support the Commission. Everyone was there waiting. Somehow, wires were crossed in Florida and the evacuation never took place. Chairman Burt said there was a lot of scrambling and he regrets that. He hopes a place was found to house the nursing home and assisted living evacuees. Chairman Burt said the County was supposed to get 140 individuals who were living in an assisted living facility in Florida along with 40-60 staff members. They were going to use the County's shelter in Robertsdale for that purpose. There was an event scheduled there for area senior citizens. It was a disappointment for them to not have it, and he hopes they will be able to reschedule their event. It is a successful event for the senior citizens who display and sell their artwork and other things to raise money for Baldwin and Mobile Counties. Chairman Burt said he is unsure if it has been rescheduled. He understands Commissioner Gruber's thoughts on foregoing any cost to the County, that would have been a cost to the senior citizens and he is not

in favor of that. The State of Florida asked for the shelter and offered to repay the County and Chairman Burt feels the Commissioners should let the State of Florida pay for the cost to open the shelter.
