If the rezoning request is approved, the applicant will not wait to develop the property. There is a deadline to maintain. Ms. Ballard said the business will bring jobs, property and sales taxes and sales revenue to the table. Ms. Ballard asked if the Commissioners have any questions.

Commissioner Underwood said Ms. Ballard answered her question about the traffic study.

Wayne Dyess, County Administrator, said everyone understands this will be a

Dollar General Store. This company has built nice stores in Baldwin County. Staff highly encourages the company to build a store similar to what is in Bay Minette. It has a nice appearance. Mr. Dyess said the Beach Express has a lot of tourists along that particular road. From the planning perspective, staff highly encourages this to be considered.

Ms. Ballard said they will be glad to consider it.

Commissioner Ball asked if there is a plan on how the store will look?

Ms. Ballard said not yet. It will be the standard store. They have not submitted plans for comments yet. It will go through the building permit process and site plan approval.

Mr. Leonard Lawley appeared before the Commission and said he and his wife own the land. The Dollar General Store will be on Oakdale Drive, off the Beach Express. All of the neighbors in this area are for this project.
