Several citizens from The Grove neighborhood in Foley were in attendance to speak regarding recent incidents of bullets hitting their properties, in some cases leaving bullet holes in their homes and other buildings. The citizens expressed concern regarding their safety and inquired what can be done to find out who is responsible for the shootings in the area and who is responsible for paying for the property damages.

The Commission, Brad Hicks, County Attorney, Wayne Dyess, County Administrator, and the citizens further discussed the shooting incidents, the Commission not having land use regulatory authority over un-zoned areas, the zoning process for the county, legal action the citizens could take, and the citizens investigating where the stray bullets are coming from and working with law enforcement if any future incidents occur.
