BM1 Amendment of Emergency Rental Assistance Program Guidelines for 21-0916 Baldwin County 21-0916

Katrina Taylor, Grants Coordinator, and Sherry-Lea Bloodworth-Botop, Director of Public/Government Affairs, discussed proposed amendments to the guidelines of the Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) due to the lack of participation from the landlords in the program resulting in grant funds not being distributed.

Ms. Taylor suggested the following three amendments to the program guidelines previously approved by the Baldwin County Commission:

Amendment #1: Payments made directly to renters when landlords refuse to participate. Amendment #2: Include utilities, late fees, relocation expenses, and reconnection fees. Amendment #3: Revise program deadline to September 30, 2022; and application submission deadline to June 10, 2022.

Ms. Botop suggested some of the current restrictions to be removed; 842 applications have been received to date, but only two applications have been completed.

Cian Harrison, Clerk Treasurer, discussed the potential cost to the County to conduct the program and explained the overall operation expenses are \$300,000 and if the program does not give out \$3 million dollars, the County will be responsible for the operating costs.

The Commission discussed the importance of getting the funds where they are needed and lessen restrictions to the guidelines to help simplify the process. The Commissioners agreed to amend the ERAP guidelines as recommended by staff.

FA1 Request to Use Byrnes Lake Landing and the Bicentennial Park 21-0901 Grounds for Overnight Camping and a Movie Screening Event "On Set Cinema" Cinema"

Wayne Dyess, County Administrator, discussed the request from Mr. Kenny Caperton, from On Set Cinema to use Byrnes Lake Landing for a movie screening event with overnight camping at Bicentennial Park. Mr. Dyess will bring the item back to a future meeting with an agreement from the requestor after discussing potential liability issues and compensation with the County Attorney.

Mr. Mitchell Nye and Mr. Charlie Ramsey, Executive Director of Gulf Coast RC&D, appeared before the Commission and discussed a request to use County-owned property off Canaan Road in Stockton to establish a community garden for the At-Ease Veteran Therapy Farming Project Program and the installation of a well which would provide irrigation to the garden.

The Commissioners asked Brad Hicks, County Attorney, if it was possible to use a portion of the property in this manner to which Mr. Hicks replied the property is currently being leased; therefore, the County will need to review the terms of the lease agreement or speak to the tenant.

Pastor Lesley Williams with the Vaughn SAIL Center appeared before the Commission to address internet issues at the SAIL Center.

Commissioner Ball discussed a grant through the CARES Act which would fund internet services that could reach areas in Stockton and other rural areas that are currently not being served.

Commissioner Davis noted this is not a unique situation and asked the CIS Department to add this area to the list of areas with internet issues.

Brian Peacock, CIS Director, discussed the internet providers in the area and suggested the Vaughn SAIL Center reach out to one them for a business solution.

FM FINANCE AND ACCOUNTING

FM1 American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Eligible Uses of Funds

Sherry-Lea Bloodworth-Botop, Director of Public/Government Affairs, provided an update on the American Rescue Plan Act. The Baldwin County Commission has received U. S. Treasury funds for the purposes of decreasing the spread of COVID-19, bringing the pandemic under control, replace lost public sector revenue to strengthen support for vital public services and help retain jobs, support immediate economic stabilization for households and businesses and address public health and economic challenges that have contributed to the unequal impact of the pandemic on certain populations. Ms. Botop will provide an updated list of projects for the Commissioners to review at the Regular Commission Meeting.

Cian Harrison, Clerk Treasurer, reported the first allocation check of \$21M was received last week; the County will receive a total of \$43,360,588 for this program. Ms. Harrison asked the Commissioners to review the list of items and confirm it is the direction they want to move in.

Matthew Brown, Interim Planning Director, discussed the draft planning jurisdiction agreements with municipalities, listing four points of discussion on questions that need to be answered: Definition of Subdivision, Identifying the Planning Jurisdiction, Provide Exclusive Jurisdiction to One Entity, and Applications Prior to Agreement.

The Commissioners; Wayne Dyess, County Administrator; and Mr. Brown discussed the planning jurisdiction agreements, the role the County is going take, sections of SB107 not being clear and the need for clarification. Further discussion took place regarding the Bill, the Commission seeking an Attorney General's Opinion, concerns about obtaining an answer to the request in a timely manner and seeking advice from other resources. Mr. Brown asked if his staff could begin conversations with municipalities regarding the matter, to which the Commissioners agreed to move forward with the municipalities.
