Ms. Linda Higbee-Smith, property owner on Higbee Road, appeared before the Commission to discuss the proposed pipeline to be installed by Belforest Water System. Ms. Smith said her understanding is that the Belforest Water System would like to complete the loop from Caney Creek Estates and she would like to know if the pipe installation would make the water system more efficient or if installation was for future development. Ms. Smith said there is no plan for this land to be sold in the foreseeable future.

Joey Nunnally, County Engineer, explained the pipe installation was not for future development, but for Belforest Water System to connect existing pipes to create redundancy in the event there is an issue with water distribution. Mr. Nunnally said the location of the pipe installation is on County right-of-way and added this license agreement allows Belforest Water System access to install the pipe. Further discussion took place regarding the possibility of a few trees which may need to be cut to allow access, who would be responsible for maintenance, dealing with potential trespassers and the width of the easements on the north and south sides of the area.

#### **BR4** Planning Jurisdiction Agreement with City of Foley

Buford King, Development Review Planner, provided information regarding the Planning Jurisdiction Agreement with the City of Foley relative to the review and approval of subdivisions outside the City's corporate limits, but within the municipal planning jurisdiction.

Mr. King explained if approved, Foley would exercise review authority for subdivisions and the County would retain authority for multiple occupancy developments, recreational vehicle parks, and manufactured home parks. Traditional subdivisions would not come before the Planning and Zoning Commission. Mr. King said the Agreement terminates on July 25, 2023, and the City of Foley's attorney has included standard language contemplating future changes to legislation to encompass the new law (Act No. 2021-297) that goes into effect in 2023.

Commissioner Underwood asked which areas were zoned, to which Mr. King replied the proposed Planning District 35 boundaries which have been finalized by the advisory committee and will be forthcoming to a future meeting for the Commission's consideration. Aside from those areas, the remainder is unzoned.






